



Keyworth Tennis Club

Weather no bar to outdoor tennis in winter season

Keyworth's men's team recorded their first win of their season 66-42 on the artificial grass courts of Attenborough. The conditions were challenging with swirling winds, periodic rain showers and occasional bright low sun on courts which were both slippy and in parts on the sides uneven due to the proximity of some rather wonderful oak trees. However, the lack of sunlight and damp conditions made players have to think twice if they wanted to risk a wide running forehand.

Top pairing of the day was Martin Croft and Leonard Nyatigi, who won their games 26 - 10, Martin playing in his usual calm manor and with his sliced ground strokes proving very effective on courts where the ball stayed low and came through quickly. Len's game was as athletic as ever with powerful ground strokes and solid volleys.

Walter Boersma and Ian Dickety, playing together for the first time, proved to be a useful paring; both are particularly quick around the court with solid ground strokes and effective serves, Walter in particular gaining many cheap points with his swerving serve, which being both fast and low was especially effective in the conditions. Walter and Ian ran out with a very creditable 23-13 win across their 36 games.

David Walker and Howard Wilkinson put in a solid performance, narrowly falling to a net negative score of -2, winning 17 and losing 19 of their 36 games, though every rubber was very close.

The ladies' team in the two-player-per-side National League lost the return leg of their match against Farnsfield - another 4-2 defeat against a stronger pairing. Great to play this standard of tennis, with Karen Monk winning her singles match to secure Keyworth's two points.

In the Nottinghamshire winter league, the ladies' team lost away to Newark in freezing temperatures but they got the match completed with a respectable 62-46 scoreline. Snow was falling on the return trip to Keyworth! Then it was off to Burton Joyce (this time in windy conditions) where mother and daughter pair Karen and Vicki Monk helped the team to a convincing win. Lucy Adams, returning from injury, and her partner Amanda Gunther were also impressive.

Happy new year!

When you love being outside as much as we do, January can be a difficult month. The sun seems to set only just after lunch, pushing us back indoors, and the dark evenings seem never ending. However, we take comfort in the fact that the days are getting gradually longer and all those bulbs that we had forgotten about can be seen pushing through the frozen ground heralding the future season.

January is also the month for planning. We can start thinking about whether the garden needs a new tree or hedge to encourage wildlife and to buy bare root specimens to plant whilst they are dormant is much cheaper than buying those that are pot grown and planted later.

Seed catalogues have started to arrive and we say to ourselves, 'this year I will do better and have bumper crops of vegetables for the table and a house filled with beautiful flowers freshly picked from the garden'. However, if the pandemic has taught us nothing else, even with those extra hours tending our plots, doing everything right, watering and nurturing, you can't control nature but only work alongside it, learning to understand it and deal with what it brings. This is what makes gardening so interesting, always providing us with a challenge to overcome, and giving us a real sense of achievement when things go well.

Every year is different and that's what gives us hope and, maybe this year will be THE year!

GARDEN JOBS FOR JANUARY

Plan your vegetable crop rotations for the coming season & start ordering your seeds!

Inspect dahlia, begonia & canna tubers for signs of rot or drying out

Remove any old hellebore leaves to expose the new flowers.

Start forcing rhubarb

Remember to keep putting out food & water out for hungry birds

Clean pots, tools ℰ greenhouses ready for spring

Start pruning roses whilst they are still dormant.

Prune apple & pear trees

What to look out for this month...

Snowdrops are so welcome during the cold, winter months usually starting to flower from January through to March.

The muntjac deer breed all year round & often visit gardens to forage for food scattered for birds & to nibble on garden plants.

The common hazel bears male catkins in winter which release pollen between late December & April. Hazel has both male & female flowers on the same tree.

The robin is Britain's national bird. They are very territorial & are one of the few small birds that sing all year round.

The dunnock is another common garden bird. also known as hedge sparrows, as they seek cover in thick vegetation making them difficult to spot.

The pecking of a woodpecker on dead wood is a mating call heard during the winter months. As well as this hammering, its signature laughing call can also be heard during this season







'Flu Vaccinations Autumn 2021

Two successful 'Flu Days' at East Leake and Keyworth centres were held on Saturday 9th and Sunday 10th October for the over 65's , when a total of 3191 patients were given the latest Flu vaccinations. Patients from the Sutton Bonington and Ruddington surgeries were also invited to these 'Flu days' and in addition, separate adult clinics were held at these smaller sugeries for local patients. To date, a total of some 5800 patients within the Village Health Group have received this year's Flu vaccine.

For the under 65 year olds who are also eligible for the free Flu vaccine, additional adult clinics are being held when, and as, further supplies of the Flu vaccine become available

For those patients not eligible for free Flu vaccination, it is noted that local pharmacies and supermarkets are offering these vaccines, by appointment, at a cost.

The Omicron Virus variation and Coronovirus Booster Vaccinations



Patients will be aware of a significant change in Government advice and strategy since the recent (November) recognition and concern about the Omicron variant of Coronavirus.

As a preventative measure, the Government has decided that all adults over the age of 18 years should receive the Coronavirus Booster vaccination. An enlarged programme of local and national vaccination centres are to be set up to ensure that this target is reached before the end of January 2022. The requirement for a 6 month delay between the Booster and any previous second vaccination has been reduced to three months.

These Booster vacinations will be available by appointment at a number of local pharmacies and at the regional mass vaccination centres such as the Forest Recreation Ground in central Nottingham.

Our understanding is that the rollout of these Booster vaccinations will be in descending age order. Most people under 40 years of age are likely to receive their invitations for these Booster vaccinations in the New Year.

All patients are advised to book their Booster vaccination on the NHS website: www.nhs.uk or by telephoning 119 - the NHS Coronavirus helpline.



It is exciting that Wildlife is getting more recognition locally and in particular the continued expansion of the Keyworth Hedgehog Highway. Wild Things Keyworth was set up to be a voice of the natural world and to be a shared way to do more to help. I have certainly learnt a lot, published a lot and got to know many more people whilst managing the page and it is with this open mind that we all continue to improve and make steps in a more supportive direction for the wildlife that lives alongside us and the habitat that it needs. All that it takes to join in, is a photo of wildlife or its habitat whilst out exercising or in the garden or of course you can just look.

So thank you to everyone who has been following and supporting the Facebook page which was set up in July 2020. Also to those people reading articles in KN and Spotted Keyworth over the past year. All of that effort has translated into households opening up access for hogs and neighbours inspiring other neighbours, like a Mexican wave. The gap surrounds have also got noticed, made from repurposed wood and additional art flourishes by Keyworth based artist Liz Waddell. They are tiny doorways to another world for our nocturnal friends, giving them options to survive and thrive.

In fact we have gifted gap surrounds to East Leake, Belper and Kelvedon in Essex to help them in their own Hedgehog Highway efforts.

From the footage we have received to make little films, to the lovely knitters who raised awareness by creating knitted 'hats' on post boxes. Also of course to Margaret who provides many of our daily walk photos of nature to inspire us on a feature called 'Margaret's Walks.' And to everyone around the village simply talking about hedgehogs more. Thanks also to the Explorer Scouts, Cubs and Beavers and leaders.

The Keyworth Hedgehog Highway project is also supported by Severn Trent on their Boost for Biodiversity scheme and their help has enabled us to provide hedgehog support items to households who have become Super Hedgehog Carers for their road. To date we have created 64 new access points (gaps) for hedgehogs through barriers, whether concrete, wood or brick. And a big thank you goes to Nick on the drilling front and Gill.

By the time you read this, another Christmas will have passed and many hogs will be in hibernation or still thinking about it. I had a hog on camera last year right up until 22

December. Hedgehogs can and do wake up, some never hibernate. Anything can disturb them, often milder temperatures because hibernation is temperature driven.

So always do the checks before garden or building work and keep water available and access to kitten biscuits for them.

Your bowl may make the difference to a passing hog and their Winter survival. Look out for more hog signage around the village!

Barry's Recipe

While I know and respect the reasons for the traditional New Year Resolutions, I find it hard to understand why we are encouraged to start a new diet during the middle of winter! Surely it would be far easier during the summer! Anyway, here is a health-conscious chicken casserole recipe. Enjoy your cooking, and wishing you all a very Happy and Healthy 2022 - Barry

Chicken Casserole With Tarragon Dumplings

175g self-raising flour

6 skinless, boneless chicken thighs, quartered

olive oil for frying

4 banana shallots or 6 standard, peeled and chopped

250g carrots, peeled and cut into chunks

3 garlic cloves, peeled and finely chopped

500ml chicken stock

4 tablespoons Dijon mustard

20g fresh tarragon, chopped (or 3 teaspoons of dried)

100g greek yogurt

salt and ground black pepper

Put 25g of the flour on a plate and season with salt and pepper. Dust the chicken in the flour. Heat a glug of oil in a frying pan, fry the chicken over a medium heat for 7-8 minutes to brown, then set aside. Put the shallots, carrots and another glug of oil in a flameproof casserole. Fry for 8 minutes, then add the garlic and cook for a further 1 minute. Pour in the stock and 150ml water, bring to a simmer, then stir in 2½ tablespoons of the mustard. Add the chicken and simmer for 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Mix the remaining flour and most of the tarragon in a bowl with a pinch of salt. Mix the yogurt with the rest of the mustard in a small bowl, then stir into the flour mix. Divide the dough into 8 equal pieces and carefully roll into balls. Stir the remaining tarragon into the stew, then arrange the dumplings over the surface. Cover and cook, gently, for 20 minutes more or until the dumplings are light and fluffy. Serves 4.

- 2 Tabsp Herbs i.e.Parlsey or Chives
- Salt and Ground Black Pepper

Season the chicken and place on a roasting tin and squeeze over the juice of one of

the lemons and dribble over a little olive oil. Slice the other lemon and tuck into the

sides of the chicken and roast 25-30 mins until golden brown. Just before you finish

baking the chicken put the Philly, Crème Frachie and herbs into a small pan and bring

to the boil slowly, and let it bubble. When the chicken is cooked remove the lemon

slices and place on a serving dish, pour the sauce over the chicken and serve with

creamy mashed potatoes and a green vegetable.

This is my last recipe for Keyworth News... 'Farewell, Goodbye, its time for me to go' from Kath's Recipes onto DEREK'S TOURS which will start again in June 2022.



A fresh start



Whilst not quite a fresh start the New Year sees a change for me as I arrive in Keyworth (as well as Bradmore, Clifton and Bridgeway Hall) as the 'new' minister (how long before I cease to be 'new' I wonder...). By tradition the Methodist year starts on 1st Sept so by 1st Jan 2022 I'll have been here for 4 months but, as anybody who has moved or changed jobs will know, it takes a year to 'find your feet' and begin to get a feeling for what is happening and to get to know all the people around you. With four Chapels I have a lot of feet to find!





So, new surroundings, new faces, new people and new communities. But is it really all new? One of the amazing things about the Bible is that it speaks of the human condition and, whilst it may have been written many generations ago, what it tells us about humanity, how we as human beings behave, still holds good. They may not have had mobile 'phones or the internet (lucky them!) but we human beings don't alter much in the way we behave

or how we deal with that messy thing we call life. Of course, the Bible was written/edited by people with a particular life-view and we cannot read what it says without recognising that it was written or edited by people in a different time to ours. We need to read the New Testament through the prism, as best we can, of 1st Century Palestine. The Old Testament even before that!

One thing we human beings tend to do as a New Year begins is to make resolutions, resolve to do, or not do, something in the coming twelve months. Perhaps there's a habit that we need to stop or a lifestyle change that we need to make to lead a healthier life. Whilst this is very laudable, I always remember that the calendar, how we denote a particular day as the start of the year, is a human construct. It really struck me when the world celebrated



the New Millennium. What we were celebrating was the human way (and our calendar is only one of several) of marking time. The sun rose and the sun set and it was just another day.

That phrase takes us back to Genesis and the story told there of creation. God brought the world into being and ever since people have been resolving to 'do better' ever since. If we take a really broad-brush approach to the Old Testament then it's a story of people resolving to follow God and then failing miserably. God brings them back

into line, they resolve to do better and then fail again. So, nothing new there then!



Just like the people of old we all try to 'do the right thing', whether that is giving up smoking, vaping or eating too much or else resolving to be nice to everybody, give to charity, not walk by the beggar in the street without at least having a conversation.

Most of us, and I include myself, will fail at some point in the year because we are human beings and so we are fallible. But the good news from the Old and New Testament is that God knows that we are

less than perfect and yet He still loves us and will forgive us. It's a bit like making your New Year Resolutions, breaking them and then being told 'Don't worry, try again. And again. And again.'

So please feel free to make your resolutions but don't give yourselves a hard time if they didn't last beyond 2 January.




